**CHAMPIONS IN THE WILD**

Which is stronger, a camel or an elephant?

Elephants are stronger. They can carry heavy things or pull down big trees. They are one of the heaviest animals in the world, too. Elephants can weigh 7,000 kilos!

Whales are the biggest animals in the world. The biggest whale is the blue whale. It can be 30 meters long. Whales are heavier than elephants, but they are slower.

Camels are faster than elephants or whales. They can run 60 kilometers an hour. Elephants can run only 40 kilometers an hour.

Camels are tall. They can be 3 meters tall. But elephants are taller (about 3-4 meters).

But giraffes are the tallest animals. Giraffes can be 5.3 meters tall. They have longer necks than other animals. Because they have such long necks, giraffes can eat the highest leaves on the trees.
